



BATTLING HIV/AIDS IS OUR BUSINESS



IHCC was established in 1998 as a medical facility which specialized in the provision of treatment to people living with HIV as well as Tuberculosis, STI's, Hepatitis B & C.

Established in 1999, WAAF operates as an NGO working within communities to educate, test and enrol reactive individuals into care, raising funds primarily through donor partnerships.

THE PRESIDENT EMERGENCY PLAN FOR AIDS RELIEF (PEPFAR)

Reached out to a total of 1879 members of the Key Population groups with educational messages encouraging them make informed choices about their health.

IMPROVING ACCESS TO LGBT RIGHTS AND HEALTH CARE IN SELECTED REGIONS OF GHANA (Human Rights Advocacy Center, Royal Netherlands Embassy*)

Integration of human rights, accessibility to quality, LGBT-specific health care, and consideration of the community needs. Mobile Clinic later provided comprehensive services, bringing HIV services to the community.

OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

Educating the public through awareness campaigns coupled with one-to-one knowledge sharing has proven to be effective. Education efforts also focus on encouraging behaviour change, such as a reduction in the number of sexual partners, increased use of condoms, and delaying the start of sexual activity.

IN-SCHOOL EDUCATION

Outreach activities in senior high schools to educate students on HIV/AIDS, to abstain from pre-marital sex, avoid teenage pregnancy, and to avoid STI's and other relevant issues.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH (Osei Kusi Foundation, You and Ghana, Agbogba Health Committee*)

Provides health education and screening in order to support communities.

STAR GHANA (Hope for Future Generations Ghana, SocioServe Ghana*)

Seeks to incentivise innovative collaboration amongst and between CSOs and other stakeholders to enhance the effectiveness of anti-corruption actions.

MOBILE VAN

Enables health education services to be brought directly to those in need.



ORPHANS AND VULNERABLE CHILDREN (OVC) (Ghana International Women's Club*)
 Provided care for children orphaned or made vulnerable by HIV and sponsored children through primary/secondary school.

ALMOND TREE (Canadian Crossroads International*)
 A skills-based training program in crafts such as bead making, batik/tie-dye with assistance from the AIDS committee of Canadian Crossroads International to assist in marketing products.

TUBERCLOSIS (TB) PROJECT
 TB outreach and screening was conducted twice a week in densely populated areas. A total of 2,153 community members, 1 out of 19 of which was diagnosed from a high risk living situation.

NOTHING FOR US WITHOUT US (NUWU) (Stop TB International*)
 Allowed for members of TB affected communities to play a major role in decision-making related to TB Care in Ghana.

COMMUNITY SYSTEM STRENGTHENING (CSS) (Global Fund*)
 Focused on enhancing access and the utilisation of TB/HIV health service delivery, and reached over 3900 persons

PASSION SQUAD
 A student-run club created to share knowledge and skills related to health, with special focus on STIs and HIV/AIDS.

HEALTHY MUM= HEALTHY BABY (National AIDS Control Programme*)
 Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission from intervention at onsite clinic.

POSITIVE ACTION FOR CHILDREN FUND (PACF) (ViiV*)
 Alleviating the impact of HIV/AIDS on women and children's health by supporting interventions that engage affected communities.
 Supports organizations working to end mother-to-child transmission of HIV.

USAID STRENGTHENING THE CARE CONTINUUM PROJECT (John Snow Research Institute*)
 Implementing activities which provide MSM with comprehensive education on HIV/AIDS, STI, GBV, HIV testing services, STI screening, and condoms/lubricant distribution.
 Regular testing, referrals to care, retention, increased viral suppression.
