World AIDS Day 2023 @ WAAF & IHCC

In celebration of World AIDS Day 2023, WAAF & IHCC facilitated a series of outreach events aimed at educating and spreading awareness about HIV & AIDS to the Haatso community. During the five working days leading up the national celebration, WAAF and IHCC successfully administered free health screening covering blood pressure and Body Mass Index (BMI) screening, HIV testing, Hepatitis B testing, and vaccination, as well as condom distribution and demonstration outside the clinic. The same services were also offered at the World AIDS Day celebration Durbar.

Additionally, our staff distributed red ribbons to attendees to show their support for the fight against the spread of HIV/AIDS. WAAF-IHCC Showcases its work to other Stakeholders




WAAF-IHCC's work was presented representatives of various Africa CSOs and networks from other African countries when they visited WAAF & IHCC as part of a South-South experience learning and sharing event. Key strategies utilized by WAAF including the use of mobile van clinics, online health services, and the engagement of PrEP champions (trained community members who are taking PrEP themselves) to promote HIV prevention and care were shared. WAAF explained that the mobile van clinic which was the highlight of this engagement, ensures better accessibility and availability of critical medical services, including ARVs and HIV testing adequately reaching those who need them the most. The online demand approach was also presented highlighting the use of virtual platforms and customized accounts on dating apps for reaching a wider population with information and services related to HIV prevention. The PrEP champion approach utilizes motivational counselling by role models who are people taking PrEP to encourage their peers as a positive step towards promoting





trust and adherence. At this event, 3 PrEP champions spoke about their work and role in advocacy, and information dissemination, as well as the benefits and challenges of the PrEP champion approach.. This approach remains extremely important in educating the public about HIV-related issues including practicing safe sex as well as the availability of another HIV prevention method outside of condoms. The meeting ended with a tour of the WAAF and IHCC premise which was enjoyed by all.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month



Breast Cancer Awareness Month is celebrated every October to raise awareness for the prevention of a disease that affects 2.3 million women worldwide every year. The awareness is to support people diagnosed with breast cancer, to educate people about risk factors, to stress the importance of regular screening, and for fundraising to support breast cancer research. WAAF and IHCC staff celebrated breast cancer awareness month by wearing pink ribbons to show support and offered them to clients as well. Our clinic, the International Health Care Centre also offered free breast screenings to clients who expressed interest in it. We also made an effort to educate

the community on breast cancer awareness through our websites and social media channels. Breast Screenings are still open all year round for both men and women as a venue to prevent late diagnosis which makes treatment more complicated and expensive.


