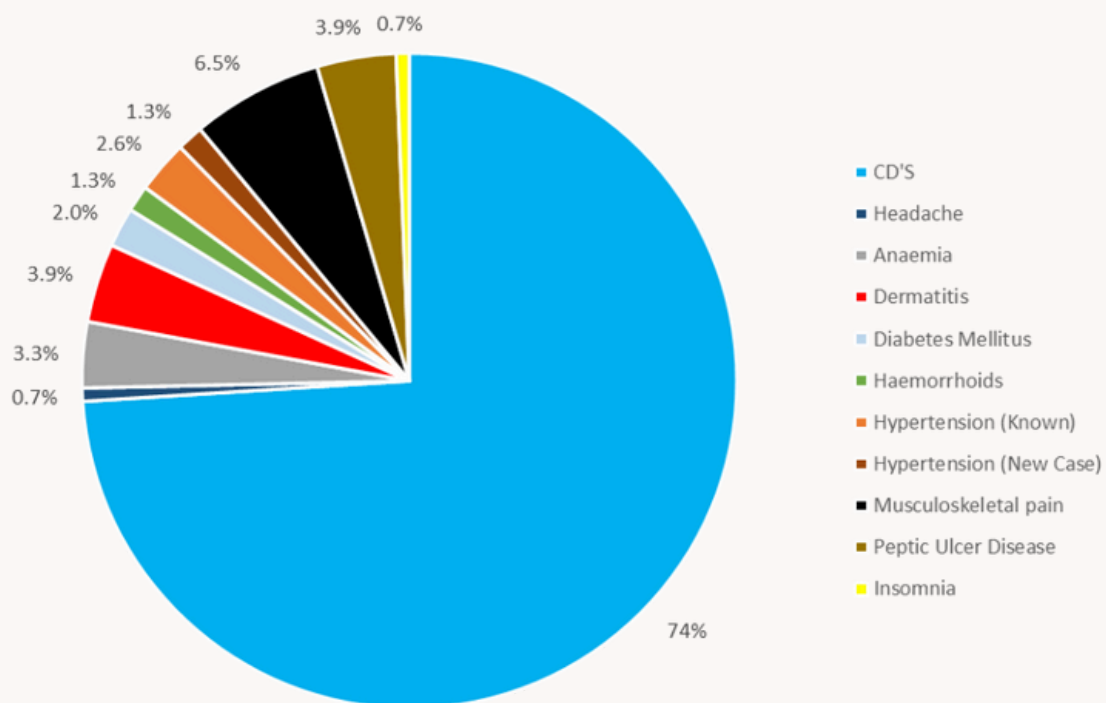

## Spotlight on Non-Communicable Diseases from IHCC

The WAAF's onsite clinic, International Health Care Centre (IHCC) is widely recognized for its HIV services. Nevertheless, the clinic is always committed to managing a broad spectrum of health conditions and increasingly focusing on managing non-communicable diseases (NCDs). The clinic's last quarter report of 2024 demonstrated this with 26% of new cases being the NCDs (Fig. 1). From chronic conditions like hypertension and diabetes to common issues like musculoskeletal pain and dermatitis, IHCC remains a trusted provider of diverse healthcare services. The quarterly data showcased IHCC's efforts to deliver holistic care beyond HIV management.

Figure 1. Distribution of new cases (last quarter, year 2024).

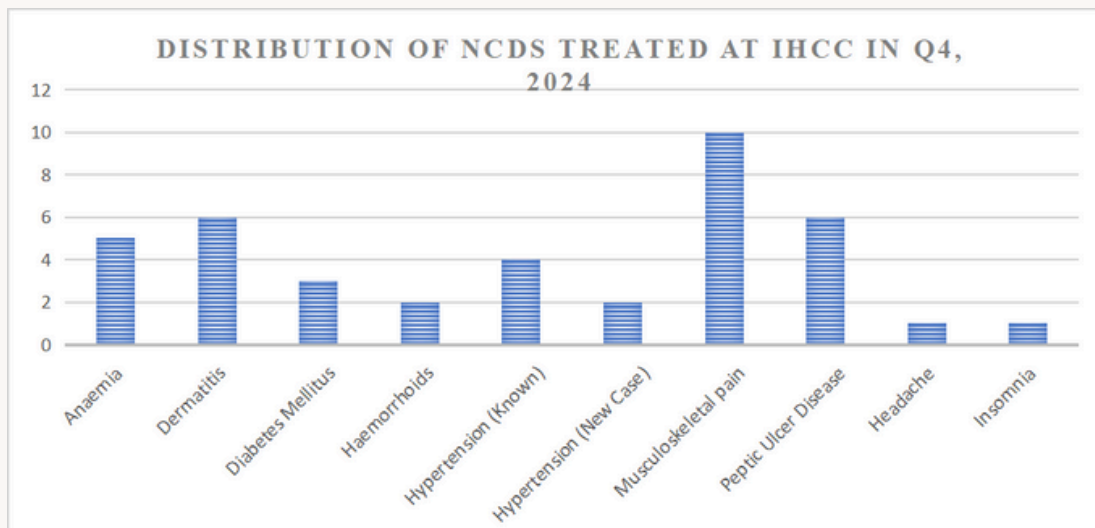

## Quarter 4 Spotlight on Non-Communicable Diseases from IHCC

- Anaemia and Hypertension (known cases) also featured prominently, with 5 and 4 cases, respectively, underscoring the need for ongoing monitoring and management of chronic conditions.
- Other conditions like Diabetes Mellitus (3 cases), Haemorrhoids (2 cases), and New Hypertension Cases (2 cases) reflect IHCC's role in managing a range of non-communicable but critical conditions that require regular care.
- Finally, Headache and Insomnia, each reported once, represent less common but still important health concerns addressed during this period.

The accompanying graph visually highlights the distribution of these NCDs, with musculoskeletal pain clearly standing out as the most prevalent condition treated at the clinic.

## 2024 World AIDS Day Launch: Embracing the Theme ‘Take the Rights Path’ to Promote HIV Awareness and Prevention



On November 1, 2024, the World AIDS Day was launched in Ghana in a special event that took place at the Accra Mall, with the theme “Take the Right Path.” The event aimed to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, and the ongoing fight against stigma, whilst emphasizing Ghana's commitment to reducing HIV/AIDS incidence through education, community engagement, and health service improvements. The launch opened with a candlelight procession, symbolizing unity in the battle against HIV/AIDS. The program, moderated by Dr. Fred Nana Poku, Director of Technical Services at the Ghana AIDS Commission, featured speeches from notable figures, including Dr. Atuahene Kyeremeh, Director General of the Ghana AIDS Commission and Dr. Ayisi Addo, the Program

Manager of the National AIDS Control Program. Dr. Kyeremeh highlighted the importance of outdoor events in raising awareness and urged citizens to remain vigilant and adhere to prescribed HIV treatments, aiming for the elimination of AIDS by 2030. Dr. Ayisi Addo honored those lost to AIDS with a moment of silence, advocating for continued efforts to eliminate the disease. Miss Eunice Ampienyiwa Mensah, Equality and Rights for All Officer from UNAIDS, using the slogan “If it’s not on, it’s not in,” promoted safe practices and acknowledged UNAIDS’ efforts in reducing stigma and supporting the HIV/AIDS response. Attendees were also educated on the history and symbolism of the HIV/AIDS emblem, reinforcing the event’s theme of taking proactive steps toward prevention. WAAF and IHCC’s participation included distributing condoms various informational materials, and actively engaging with attendees sharing experiences of our work, answering questions related to HIV care and correcting misinformation some had. This engagement emphasized our commitment to public health, reinforcing the importance of HIV awareness and prevention and fighting all forms of stigma related to HIV. The event concluded with a celebratory atmosphere and music, marking a successful day of solidarity and renewed dedication to public health.



## WAAF-IHCC Hosts Health Screening for the Community as Part of the 2024 World AIDS Day



In the last week of November, leading to the 2024 World AIDS Day on December 1st, WAAF in partnership with its onsite clinic; International Health Care Centre (IHCC), conducted health screening exercises at the forecourt of its head office in Haatso. These health screenings were part of WAAF and IHCC's contribution towards the 2024 World AIDS Day activities. Health screenings were held daily from 8 am to 1 pm and aimed to raise awareness about critical health issues including HIV and at the same time offer health essential services to the Haatso community.

Participants benefited from HIV testing and counseling, blood pressure monitoring, blood sugar assessments, BodyMass Index (BMI) evaluations, Hepatitis B testing and vaccination. Over the 5 days of the screenings, a total of 116 individuals benefitted with 96 undergoing HIV testing, of which two tested reactive and were both referred to facilities closer to them for further care. 60 people tested for Hepatitis B with six testing positive, all were referred to health facilities for further care, and two of those who tested negative received the first shot of their vaccinations and were scheduled to for the next one.

The screening exercises also provided for educational materials and free condoms to support ongoing HIV prevention efforts, with healthcare professionals ensuring participants were treated with respect and confidentiality. WAAF-IHCC through this initiative, emphasized the importance of regular testing, early detection, proactive health management, and reducing the stigma surrounding HIV/AIDS, thereby creating a supportive environment for all.

## WAAF Joins the GHANET World AIDS Day 2024 Health Walk and Rally to Raise HIV Awareness



The WAAF team on Saturday, 30th November 2024, actively participated in Ghana HIV and AIDS Network (GHANET)'s World AIDS Day Health Walk and AIDS Rally held in Accra. The 10-kilometer walk, which started from Obra Spot near the Kwame Nkrumah circle/Interchange and ended at the Osekan Park, aimed to raise awareness about HIV self-testing, prevention, and reducing stigma. With the 2024 World AIDS Day theme, "Take the Right Path," the walk was also meant to emphasize the ongoing fight against HIV/AIDS and the need for community involvement in achieving the goal of eliminating AIDS by 2030.

With hundreds of participants, including key individuals like Dr. Kyeremeh Atuahene, Director General of the Ghana AIDS Commission, and Dr. Stephen Ayisi Addo, Program Manager of the National AIDS and STI Control Programme, the walk was not only a physical activity but also a platform to promote HIV testing, safe practices, and HIV treatment adherence. Educational materials, condoms and souvenirs were distributed to participants and the public, reinforcing commitment to public health and HIV prevention. Placards and banners were raised to advocate against stigma and discrimination toward persons living with HIV, aligning with WAAF's mission of creating an inclusive society where those affected by HIV and AIDS can live without fear of stigma or prejudice. The rally also served as an opportunity for WAAF to engage with the community and reiterate the importance of regular health check-ups, HIV testing, and the role of early detection in achieving better health outcomes.

## Strengthening HIV Awareness and Support: WAAF's Participation in the 2024 National World AIDS Day Durbar



On December 2, 2024, the Ghana AIDS Commission held a colorful national World AIDS Day celebration in a durbar at the forecourt of the Accra Mall under the theme, “Take the Rights Path: My Health, My Right!” The event brought together healthcare professionals, policymakers, community leaders, and individuals affected and infected by HIV/AIDS to advocate, educate, and engage in dialogue on addressing HIV/AIDS in Ghana.

The program highlighted advancements in HIV treatment, the importance of community engagement, stigma reduction, safe sex practices, and mental health support. Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), including WAAF, exhibited their works, services and resources and provided professional and confidential HIV testing and counseling. Condoms and IE&C Materials were also distributed by the various organizations. At the WAAF's stand, 44 individuals were tested with no positive cases recorded. This all-important event created an interactive space to share knowledge, access resources, and strengthen the collective resolve to fighting the HIV/AIDS epidemic.
